1) Powerpoint Presentation - Social Media

- present Social Media in classes within English and IT lessons
- after the presentation, time for discussion among students and teachers:
 - Do you consider Social Media beneficial? If yes, in what way?
 - Do you consider Social Media harmful? If yes, in what way?
 - How much of Social Media is too much?
 - Are you afraid of Social Media addiction?
 - Why is using of Social Media more popular among youngsters?
 - Are Social Networks real communities?
 - Are users of Social Media entitled to privacy? Why or why not?
 - Can people learn (thanks to Social Media) good interpersonal skills?
 - etc.











2) <u>School noticeboard – Social Media</u>

• as a feedback of social media presentation and a part of the public awareness campaign, students create a school noticeboard with information about different types of social media with statistics, "symptoms" of addiction etc.










3) <u>Leaflet – Advantages and Disadvantages of Social</u> <u>Networks</u>

- students create a leaflet of advantages and disadvantages of Social Networks
- the leaflet is used as a part of the noticeboard "Social Media"
- the leaflet can be distributed among students and their parents as a part of public awareness campaign







4) <u>Questionnaire – Social Media</u>

- students create a questionnaire for all age groups and distribute them among schoolmates, their friends and family members
- evaluation of the questionnaire
- questions from the questionnaire can be discussed further within English lessons, some questions can be debated in greater detail = as a groupwork prepare answers for the following questions, e.g.:
 - nr. 2. Which social networks do you use? (Why do you prefer a certain network over others?)
 - nr. 11. Can you become addicted to social networks? (What does an ,, addiction "mean?, When people become addicted to social networks? What are the ways to ,, cure "someone?)
 - nr. 15. Have you ever experienced cyberbullying? (How would you describe the term "cyberbullying"? Have you ever cyberbullied someone?/being cyberbullied? What do people cyberbully others? Do you know what to do when cyberbullied? etc.)



6) <u>School noticeboard – Cyberbullying</u>

• as a feedback, students create a school noticeboard with information regarding cyberbullying, cybergrooming, sexting etc., help line info etc.

- within IT lessons students prepare a leaflet with basic rules for the safe Internet
- it can be followed by a discussion with personal experience and recommendation regarding the safe Internet services providing help with problems etc.
